Lawrence - Douglas County has approximately:


- 130-150 people who will experience homelessness for the first time
- 260-300 people experiencing chronic homelessness right now
- an untold number facing eviction or mortgage default

Challenge Meets Opportunity

New federal, state, and local funding can support:

- initiatives specifically to end homelessness
- rental assistance up to two years to prevent/ lift people out of homelessness
- new long-term housing assistance
- supportive services for to enable success for people housed after life on the streets

GOALS of the SUMMIT




