- While many parts of the state may experience a frost this week, many asters may keep blooming until a hard freeze ends their blooming. By the end of this week many trees will have lost their leaves and the landscape begins to look dormant.
- In Kansas, there is over 2 1/2 hours difference between the earliest sunrise and the latest sunrise, and the same diffference occurs between earliest and latest sunsets. Daylight savings time doesn't change the length of the day even one second, but it does mean that you need to make sure you push back your clock one hour Saturday night/Sunday morning if you don't want to show up an hour early to your next event!
- Reservoirs across the state are great places to watch migratory waterfowl. Sparrows, shorebirds, migrating redbird/grackle flocks, seagulls, quail, eagles, geese and ducks can be found, and owls and raptors abound. If you're lucky you might hear a solitary tree frog croaking around dusk, soon to migrate into the mud to overwinter there.
- You can still hear late season crickets and see ruddy colored grasshoppers on sunny days; dragonflies can still be seen sunning themselves, while spiders continue to balloon their gossamer to take flight and migrate south across the sky.
