Many migratory songbirds are returning right now: as are the tree leaves: watch for both this week!

- If you are out in the woods this week, keep an eye open for the beautiful May apple blossom. Look for the distinctive umbrella-like leaves, and to find the blossom underneath, you only need to look under the plants with two leaves, with the flower emerging at the fork between the two leaves. The understory wildflowers are beginning to wrap up with the emergence of the taller tree leaves, which shades all below, and those plants shift from flowers to seed and berry growing.
 - Coyotes, turkeys, skunks, opossums, turkey vultures, swallows, foxes, copperheads and rabbits are raising young right now--drive carefully!
 - Some of the native prairie wildflowers currently blooming include prairie violets, wood betony, hoary puccoon, creamy wild indigo, verbena, stargrass, oxalis, New Jersey tea, spring beauty and hoary puccoon. Cool season grasses are growing fast, with bluegrass already forming seedheads.
- Many fish also will start spawning, including carp, sunfish and many types of shiners. Wasps are building nests and bumblebees are checking each opening flower bud. I saw a butterfly going from one new cottonwood leaf to another: was it finding sweetness or just in awe of the tender young leaves?
