Its flowers attract many types of bees, butterflies and even hummingbirds and other birds like its seeds in the winter. It needs less water than the other Liatris species so it can be found further west.

If you see large numbers of dragonflies right now, chances are that they are Green darners, who, like monarch buttflies, migrate. They take 3 generations to do it: The northward migration is by darners who hatch in February along the Gulf coast, then migrate north to lowa, Minnesota and even further north, where they lay eggs and die. The new generation spends the summer up north and are passing through to get back to the Gulf. The third generation spends their lives on the coast and lay eggs in late winter to begin the cycle over again.

Speaking of migration, there is a free monarch tagging event at the Baker wetlands Saturday morning starting at 8am. Check out monarchwatch.org for other fall events.

Speaking of free AND related to migration, Jayhawk Audubon is having a free bird walk in the Rice Woods in central Douglas County on Wednesday, September 14 at 8am. Check their calendar for details.

Blue Pitcher's sage, fall thistles, white and false boneset, snow on the mountain continue to bloom alongside goldenrods and sunflowers; the first blooming asters are coming soon!

If you think about it around 8am on Monday, look west and you'll see the setting moon. The moon will get smaller each successive day and be further east at 8am-Sat. it will be south.
