

Cost Recovery Philosophy

Lawrence Parks & Recreation Cost Recovery Model

Departmental Cost Recovery Goals

Tier 5: Private or for profit, exclusive use rentals such as tournaments, shelter/gazebo rental, facility rentals and special events held on City property. Programs such as trips, personal training, private lessons and arts and crafts fairs.

Tier 4: Non-profit/civic exclusive use rentals. Programs such as youth and adult competitive sports leagues, classes or clinics focused on advanced activities and/or having a pre-requisite for attendance.

Tier 3: Beginning to intermediate classes, programs, and clinics. General youth camps, natural resource education, recreational youth sports leagues. Advance therapeutic/adaptive programs

Tier 2: Monitored use of a park, facility or activity that does not require registration such as drop-in swimming, free play, game rooms and weight and cardio use. Beginning to intermediate therapeutic/ adaptive programs.

Tier 1: Community-wide special events sponsored by LPRD, non-monitored use of parks and trails, inclusion services intended to comply with ADA standards.

CONSIDERABLE COMMUNITY BENEFIT 10% to 50% Cost Recovery




PBB (Priority Based Budgeting)

Parks & Recreation Budget


2023 Operating Budget Expenditures

* Tax & Fee supported


Parks/Cemeteries/CIP - \$9.2M

Cost Recovery Comparison





2023 Fees

• Parks and Recreation has over 1,500 fees

Cemetery, Facility Rentals, Park/Shelter Rentals, Field Rentals, Programming

- 2023 Fee increases mostly range from 10-30%
 - Market rates have been analyzed
- *These fees will be effective Feb. 1, 2023



Recreation Programs

2022 to 2023 Fee Changes: Summer Camp - $$100 \rightarrow 130 PPNC Summer Camp - $$130 \rightarrow 190 DCABA Baseball U8 - $$110 \rightarrow 120 Adult Kickball - $$165 \rightarrow 180



Recreation program fees are analyzed and adjusted as needed based on cost recovery (which takes into account instructor fees, supplies, staffing costs, etc.) and market rate comparisons.


2022 to 2023 Property Lot Rate Changes:

- Single Grave Space \$1,050 → \$1,375
- Non-Resident \$1,500 → \$1,950

2022 to 2023 Fee Changes:

Daily Admission

- Child/Teen/Senior \$5 ➡\$6
- Adult \$6 **→**\$7

*Ex. Projected revenue increase \$25,000

Lane Rental

- Short Course \$7.75/hour →\$10/hour
- Long Course \$15.50/hour ⇒\$20/hour



2022 to 2023 Fee Changes:

Riding Fees (18 holes)

- Mon-Thurs \$37 → \$44

*Ex. Projected revenue increase \$106,000



Closing The Budget Gap

2022 projected EOY revenue
\$3.7M
*\$4.6M budget for 2022

General Fund gap of \$900,000

2023 projected revenue with fee increases

\$4.4M-\$4.6M

*\$6.4M budget for 2023 General Fund gap \$1.8M-\$2M

- Fees will be increased on an annual basis
 - We need to get back on track
 - We will still fall short of budget
- Marketing efforts will be enhanced to help increase attendance for programs and passes
- More effort on Sponsorships will be brought forward in the coming year



Advisory Board Task Force

- Options considered for Program Fee Increases
 - Option 1 \$800k estimated increase in revenue
 - Most fees between 10-30%
 - Option 2 \$900k estimated increase in revenue
 - Increasing fees higher than 30% across the board
- Options considered for Facility Admission Fees
 - Facilities include SPL, Holcom, ELC, CB, PPNC
 - Option 1 \$400k estimated increase in revenue
 - Charge fees to all family members
 - Option 2 \$200k estimated increase in revenue
 - Only charge fees to adults; youth free

Priorities/Values

- Fair and equitable
 - Any adult at 185% or less than the federal poverty rate will get a free pass
 - Demonstrate trust with our community and not requirement documentation
- Youth free
- Non-resident rate for residents outside of Douglas County
