

Butterfly milkweeds can still be found in area prairies, providing colorful red-to-orange fireworks. Other wildflowers to look for include gray coneflower, echinacea, blackeyed susan, prairie clovers, daisy fleabane, Culver's root, oxeye daisy, beebalm and slender mountain mint. Many milkweeds are also transitioning to creating seed pods: notice the variety of sizes as some are ahead of others. Look at the stalks of both flowers and grasses for spittle bug bubbles.

Elderberries have begun to form, sycamores are shedding their bark, Kansas dogwood berries are green, soon to turn white, while sumac seedheads are turning reddish brown: a good time for making <a href="sumac-ade">sumac-ade</a>. Osage orange balls are growing and black walnuts are almost full size already.

Invasive weeds Queen Ann's Lace, teasel and chickory are all going strong along roadsides while the sweet clovers and vetches are going to seed. Sericea lespedeza is getting taller.

This Saturday, if you're in the Baker Wetlands vicinity, consider joining the bird walk starting at 7:30am. If you're elsewhere, consider their anticipated bird checklist at a wild area near you: indigo bunting, common yellowthroat, dickcissel, rose-breasted grosbeak, pileated woodpecker, willow flycatcher, eastern wood pewee, Baltimore and orchard orioles, blue grosbeak and Bell's vireo.

If skies are clear after midweek, we'll have dark, moonless nights, which are perfect for admiring the Milky Way.
