Western ragweed is producing flower seedheads and its taller cousin, giant ragweed, are beginning to produce pollen and it will only get worse in coming weeks, resulting in many runny noses and itchy eyes. Don't blame goldenrods!

Look out for walnuts dropping, their green husks turning brown and drying out after that. Hedge apples are growing right on track, as are acorns, and check sycamores for seed balls.

The beautiful blue blossoms of Pitcher's Sage and the gentians are worth going to area prairies to see. Other wildflowers blooming now are boneset, various goldenrods and fall thistles, swamp milkweed, slender mountain mint euphorbia corollata, snow-on-the-mountain, and many sunflower species,

Have you noticed Monarch butterflies flying across the eastwest roads, going north to south yet? These and other butterflies can be found as adults, caterpillars and chrysalises-look on butterfly-friendly plants for any of these stages.

More and more blackbirds are gathering on telephone/power lines, getting ready to migrate in their amoeba-like flocks. It's so fun to watch the flocks rise and fall unpredictably but quite beautifully: see if you can take a video as the flocks get bigger and bigger.
