In the Lawrence area Clinton Lake and the Baker Wetlands Discovery Center observation tower/blind, or the Wells Overlook tower/pavilion are fine locations to watch migrating birds gathering, flying and swimming, particularly around sunrise and sunset. And anywhere, with moonrise/set around sunset/rise, you might be treated to silhouettes of bird flocks crossing the disk of the moon

Even though the drought continues, with over 94% of the state currently in drought, the leaves on trees and native grasses will continue to turn color this week, albeit in a somewhat muted fashion compared to wetter years. This coming weekend is the Maple Leaf Festival in Baldwin City.
It's also a perfect time to go look for the last blooms of the season, which will be mostly asters, some lingering members of the sunflower tribe, some goldenrods and perhaps a gentian or

two. Dry conditions have extended the time for collecting wildflower and grass seeds, which can be spread out this fall/winter in areas where you want them to grow next year.
