Many sparrows are to be found in grasses and weedy stalks right now—see if you can identify them. At reservoirs there are still plenty of gulls, owls and hawks, more ducks and geese, and if you're lucky maybe some cormorants and a returning eagle.

If you see a daddy longlegs, be assured that it is safe to let it crawl onto your hand as they cannot bite. Hit your wrist up against your other hand, launching the daddy longlegs into the air and they will float down like a parachute, always landing feet first. Clap your hands nearby and the antennae will point your way since their "ears" are on the tips of the antennae.

Look for clusters of box elder beetles gathering in sunny spots while ladybugs will soon be gathering in corners of your rooms. Other bugs migrate under tree bark, into the gathering leaf layer on the ground, or even under ground. Toads and turtles have begun to dig into the dirt and any mud they can find to overwinter in deep hibernation.

This week is National Birdability Week, and the Lawrence Bird Alliance is celebrating "making birding accessible for "everybody and every body" by leading an accessible bird walk at the Baker Wetlands Discovery Center this Saturday at 9am.
