The Pleiades, the Hyades and Orion all rise in the east around 9pm this week, with the moon marching across the sky, moving further east and growing larger each successive night,

becoming full on Friday night, when it rises at sunset: a beautiful sight to behold. When the moon is so bright, you can still see Saturn to the south, Venus to the west, and Jupiter

rising after the moon in the east.

When people think of ducks, they probably are thinking of dabblers, the ducks that float along the water, dipping their heads under water and their tails sticking up toward the sky, unlike divers, who fly and dive under water to catch their food.

Dabblers include mallards, wood ducks, shovelers, teals, widgeons and pintails. Right now, there are over 100,000 dabblers at Loess Bluffs Wildlife Refuge near the Missouri River,

so check out a reservoir near you.

S This Sunday, Nov. 17 is the peak day for deer-car accidents, with around 700 of the 10,000 annual deer collisions in the Kansas occurring on that day. Drive carefully, especially around dawn and dusk
